Meet the team: Clinical Pharmacists

Clinical pharmacists are increasingly working as part of general practice teams. They are highly qualified experts in medicines and can help people with a range of health care needs.

We have a wide team of pharmacists here at Lion Health. They assist the team with medication reviews, resolving issues and problems with medication, monitoring of high-risk medication and also perform audits to ensure safety and efficiency. They are a valuable member of the team. It may be that you have a review with one of them following your long term condition review, or if you are on a lot of complex medication.

Community pharmacists work at your local pharmacy and dispense medications once they have been prescribed by Lion Health. Alongside this, many pharmacies are able to help with minor illnesses, including:

- Earache (1-17 years),
- Impetigo (1 year and older),
- Infected insect bites (1 year and older),
- Shingles (18 years and over),
- Sinusitis (12 years and older),
- Sore throat (5 years and older) and

Clinicians Corner:

Sepsis Awareness

Sepsis is a life threatening condition that arises when the body's response to an infection injures its own tissues and organs. Sepsis can lead to shock, multiple organ failure and death especially if not recognised and treated promptly. It's estimated that as many as 245,000 people develop this condition each year in the UK. As humans we come into contact with many 'bugs' during our lifetime, some of which cause infections. Our body's natural defence systems and immunity fight these infections, frequently without any need to visit the GP or hospital. Sepsis can occur when the body's immune system-which normally helps us fight infection – overreacts, causing damage to tissues and organs.

It's important to note that it's not possible to catch sepsis or pass it onto others. Not every infection will cause someone to develop sepsis however almost any infection can trigger sepsis – that's why it is important to be aware of symptoms.

Common infections precipitating sepsis include: Chest infections (pneumonia), UTIs, Abdomen infections (appendicitis, gall bladder), Skin, soft tissue infections (cellulitis, wound infections). Sepsis primarily affects very young children and older adults and is more common in people with underlying health conditions, it can also be triggered in those who are fit and healthy.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

SYMPTOMS IN CHILDREN

A child may have sepsis if he or she:

- Is breathing very fast
- · Has a 'fit' or convulsion
- · Looks mottled, bluish, or pale
- Has a rash that does not fade when you press it
- Is very lethargic or difficult to wake
- Feels abnormally cold to touch

SYMPTOMS IN ADULTS

An adult may have sepsis if they show any of these signs:

Slurred speech or confusion

Extreme shivering or muscle pain

Passing no urine (in a day)

Severe breathlessness

t feels like you're going to die

Skin mottled or discoloured

Call III or **contact your GP** if you're worried about an infection. **Call 999** or **visit A&E** if someone has one of the sepsis symptoms.

JUST ASK "COULD IT BE SEPSIS?"

Sepsis can be difficult to spot, particularly in the earlier stages. There is no single sign and no single diagnostic test – symptoms can also present differently in adults and children.

It requires a full clinical assessment. A patient who is unwell and has signs or symptoms of an infection should be evaluated for the presence of sepsis by looking for one or more organs not working as they should be—this will include monitoring and blood tests. People with sepsis require a hospital admission and some may require critical care.

Booking Blood Tests & X-rays

Please be aware that there is still a booking system in place for both blood tests and X-rays. There is no longer a walk-in service.

Blood tests

There are a number of locations where you can have your blood test done locally, including Corbett Hospital, Merry Hill Shopping Centre (on the ground floor, near the NatWest Bank) and Russells Hall Hospital. Please be aware children's blood tests (those under 16 years of age) can still only be carried out at Russells Hall Hospital. To have your blood test done, you will need to use the online booking system by visiting

www.dgft.nhs.uk/patients-and-visitors/blood-tests/

Please remember to take your blood test stickers with you, as the team will be unable to take your blood if you do not have these which will lead to unnecessary delays in your care. Our reception team are able to print these out for you.

X-rays

X-rays can be carried out at Russells Hall, Corbett or Guest Hospitals. You can arrange your X-ray by calling 01384 244 722. Please call the day after your appointment with us, as it can take 24 hours for the hospital to receive our X-ray request. Phone lines are open between 9am – 4.30pm, Monday to Friday.

You do not need any paperwork for this appointment; the hospital will have it all on their system.

Your results will be sent to the requesting GP (or your named GP if it was a locum GP or other health care professional who requested them). We operate a 'no news is good news' policy so be reassured that a follow-up appointment will be arranged by the team if it is appropriate to do so, or if it has previously been agreed with you.

Lion Health Flu Week 2024

Within the next coming months Lion Health will be introducing its annual **Flu week** where patients can receive both their flu and Covid-19 booster vaccinations. The flu vaccine helps to protect against which can be a serious or life-threatening illness. You can receive a free flu vaccination if you are:

- Aged over 65,
- have certain long term health conditions,
- are pregnant, live in a care home,
- are the main carer of an older or disabled person or receive a carers allowance,
- live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
- Front line health and social care workers are also eligible.


